NOTE: If a due process complaint is filed on behalf of a child with a disability who is not currently receiving educational services, or regarding placement in an interim alternative education setting or a manifestation determination, the Office of Administrative Hearings is responsible for scheduling an expedited due process hearing upon proper notice. This hearing must occur within 20 school days of the date the complaint requesting the hearing is filed. A resolution meeting must occur within seven (7) days of receiving notice of the due process complaint unless it is waived by both parties (34 CFR §300.532 and COMAR 13A.05.01.15(C)).
